1	Basics for Club Secretaries and Treasurers: Tools, best practices, and crossover responsibilities	Tools to support each role, best practices, and crossover responsibilities of Secretary and Treasurer; tax filing and other legal considerations; Point out that how responsibilities of the two roles are assigned are Club specific.	Secretaries and Treasurers are comfortable in their role and identifying resources. Continuing officers are energized with new ideas and insights. A network of fellow officers and tools to support your role.
1	Doing Good in the World leveraging the global opportunities through The Rotary Foundation (TRF)	Key TRF initiatives, stories of the Rotary difference, a template for strengthening culture of giving, member benefits. Grants are our vehicle for doing good in the world but giving provides the engine.	Participants are inspired by the opportunity to make a difference in the world through the Rotary Foundation and can articulate through stories the value of giving to their Club and beyond. Hearts opened.
1	Sharing your Club Vocational and Community Projects: Rotary through Social Media	Best practices and easy tools for promoting Club actions through Facebook and other social media; Demonstrate District and Club options. Engage participants in recognizing how to promote Vocational and Community Projects.	Participants are inspired to expand Rotary & Club Public Image through Social Media; become active in promoting their Club's Vocational and Community projects "real time"; Participants know resources for website and social media setup assistance.
1	The joy of REGL / RYLA experiences AND the special opportunity as counselor	The special opportunity to serve as REGL/RYLA counselor; the difference REGL/RYLA make for our youth; what is expected of counselors and how to participate.	REGL/RYLA is a special opportunity not just for youth but for Rotarians who participate; Expanded cadre of Rotarians interested in serving as counselor. Know expectations.

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1	Attracting and Engaging Young Adults in Rotary	Focus on Vocations as means of attracting young adults in Rotary. Explore how to expand and engage Rotaract as well as engage Rotary & Rotaract Alumnae.	Clubs recognize Vocations as a means of attracting young adults. Participants come away with new ideas for attracting and engaging younger members and Rotaractors.
1	Club President Elects (Presidents 2018-19)	Building strong Clubs through effective meetings and retreats. Open discussion on PE preparedness and opportunity to share ideas, questions, etc.	PEs leave confident and charged for a quick start. Expand connections within the PE Class
1	How to Invigorate Interact Clubs and set Interact apart from other organizations	How to invigorate existing Interact Clubs and fortify their members and organization; Setting Interact apart from other organizations on campus and in their community; Creating an Interact environment that will attract, engage and empower youth.	Participants will be motivated and inspired to champion Interact. They will learn about strategies that have worked and share their best practices and leave the session with tools for implementation and new found enthusiasm.
2	Building Strong Club Leadership through RLI and Club Visioning - How to get involved	RLI program and offerings – why RLI is important to individual and Clubs; Opportunity to revitalize and expand Clubs through Visioning and Vision to Action	Clubs recharged to engage with Club Visioning; Expand RLI programs to offer at least one per Area
2	International Partnerships - Twin Clubs, Projects, Rotaplast	Rotary is engaging in new forms of partnerships; share examples of emerging Twin Clubs and ways clubs are partnering with international projects - Astana, Los Barriles, Open World. Participants are comfortable with exploring the vast Rotary resources available on line -- especially the nuts and bolts of ClubRunner, Rotary Club Central (RCC), Showcase, etc.
2	How to keep yourself, youth, and Club safe when working with Youth	Review scenarios - especially in unconscious situations that put youth, Rotarians, and Clubs at risk. Perception is everything. The new Youth Protection Policies. Who needs to and how to be certified. Recommend having at least Club program on new policy.	Participants are conscious of and take responsibility for protecting themselves, their clubs, and our youth. Greater ownership of the value of our Youth Protection Policies.
2	Human Trafficking - Building Awareness in your Community	Human trafficking is going on in all our communities; How to recognize it; What are the conditions that lead to tracking exposure; The opportunity for Rotary to engage in preventing human trafficking.	Participants see how they and Rotary can help build community awareness of how prevalent human tracking is and how to prevent it. Identify actions and programs that make a difference.
2	New to Rotary - how to jump start you finding your place in your Club and District	A deeper fire side chat for newer Rotarians. Reaffirm Rotary basics that are not necessarily a part of regular Rotary meetings. Share the bigger picture of Rotary and opportunities to engage within and beyond your Club. Rotary Academy as a tool for learning more about Rotary through self-paced online study.	Newer members envision broader ways to engage in and follow their heart through Rotary; understand the 5 Avenues of Service and 6 Areas of Focus - and link to their why.
2	Ways for clubs to work jointly within an Area and District for a bigger impact & higher matching grants	Present examples of how Clubs are partnering within their Areas and across the District. Demonstrate the opportunity for bigger impact including higher matching grants.	Participants envision new ways for their Clubs to engage with other Clubs to have a bigger impact in their community.

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
